Julia Wood Prize 2018

The Principal and Fellows of St Hugh's College offer the Prize, worth up to £500, for the best historical essay submitted by a pupil who, at the closing date, has been in the Sixth Form of any school or college for a period of not more than two years. The winning essay will be published on the College's website.

The choice of historical subject is left to candidates. Essays should be between two thousand and four thousand words and submitted by the candidate as a Microsoft Word document through the form on the College website:

Essays should be submitted by 5pm on **Friday 27th July 2018**. The winner will be announced on the College website by the end of September 2018.

Last year, essays shared the prize. The winners were: Ned Ashcroft, in the Lower Sixth of St Paul's School, for his essay entitled 'What was the significance of the British Radical Movement of the 1790s?'; Jessica Curry, in the Upper Sixth of St Columba's Senior School, Kilmacolm, for her essay entitled 'The playboy who brought down the Republic? An assessment of the importance of Clodius Pulcher in the fall of the Roman Republic'; and Felix Stocker, in the Lower Sixth of Eton College, for his essay entitled 'To what extent did the Carolingian Renaissance innovate beyond Classical culture?'.
