## St Hugh's College, University of Oxford Julia Wood Prize 2015

The Principal and Fellows of St Hugh's College offer the Prize, worth up to £500, for the best historical essay submitted by a pupil who, at the closing date, has been in the Sixth Form of any school or college for a period of not more than two years. The winning essay will be published on the College's website.

Essays should be submitted by a school or college, and no institution should submit more than four essays. **Candidates should state whether they are in Year Twelve or Year Thirteen, and should give a home and a school address, as well as an email address.** The choice of historical subject is left to candidates. Essays should be between two-thousand and four-thousand words; typed, or clearly hand-written, on one side of the paper only. Two copies of each essay should be sent; they will not be returned.

Essays should be sent - by Friday 10th July 2015 - to The Julia Wood Prize Committee, St Hugh's College, Oxford, OX2 6LE. It is hoped to make an award on or before Saturday 22nd August.

*In 2014, the prize was awarded to Cecilia Murray-Brown, of St Mary's School, Ascot. Two further prizes were also awarded to Lily Spicer, of Oundle School, and to Joshua Stickland, of King's College, Taunton.*
